Subaru Corporation Announces Production, Japan Sales and Export Results for October 2019 (Flash Report)

< Production >

- Domestic production decreased as operations at the company's Gunma plant were halted for four and a half days due to Typhoon Hagibis (Typhoon 19) damage to a part of the supply chains.
- While production of the Ascent increased, overseas production decreased as production volume of the all-new Legacy and Outback models was controlled in order to ensure quality of new vehicles before ramp-up. (Production of the two models started at the end of July.)

< Sales in Japan >

- Passenger vehicle sales decreased due to production halt at the Gunma plant and a decrease in demand for the Forester as momentum boosted by the launch of its fully-redesigned version waned.
- Mini vehicle sales decreased as sales of the Sambar and other models declined.

< Exports >

- Exports from Japan decreased due to production halt at the Gunma plant.
